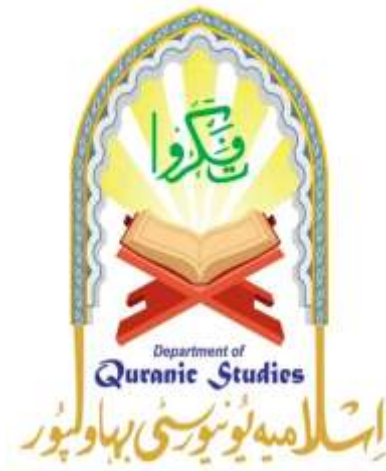

Guidelines for Authors

Only articles submitted through Journal Website (OJS) will be accepted. Articles should not exceed 25 pages of type script in MS Word on A4 size paper. Text font of articles in English language should be 12 and references in 10. Urdu and Arabic language Articles font 14 and references in 12. Articles themes fonts of English in "Times New Roman", Arabic in Sakkal Majallah and Urdu in Jameel Noori Nastaleeq font. Full name of author along with professional affiliation / address, phone and e-mail address should be written on the manuscript. All submissions must include a 150-250 word abstract with five keywords, introduction, discussion, results, summary and conclusions.
